Prayer for the Eucharistic Revival

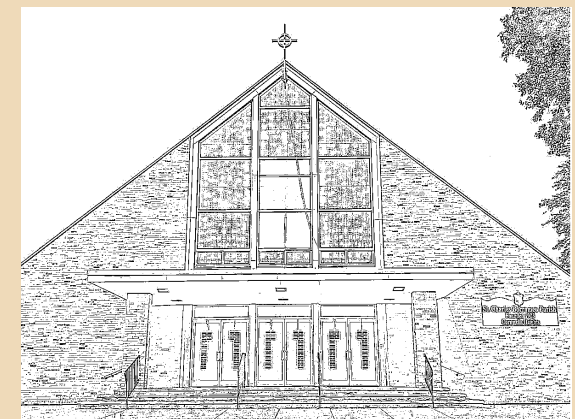
My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You! I beg pardon for those who do not
