A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

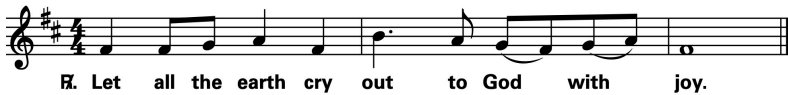
