Alleluia! Alleluia! To the Triune Majesty.

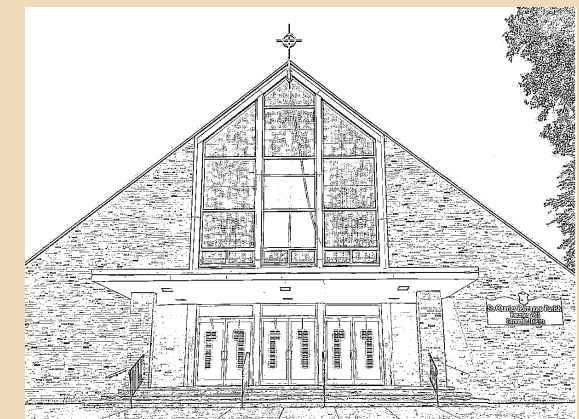
### Prayer for the Eucharistic Revival
